Copper Enameling

This ancient art is still alive today in our club. The process uses vitreous enamel, a finely ground glass, that is placed on prepared copper surfaces and then heated to a high temperature in the club kilns. The enamel is baked onto the copper, leaving a smooth, hard surface.

The only limit is your imagination! You choose the colors that you want to use and the shapes and forms of the art you want to make.

Enameling classes are offered for a nominal fee to anyone wishing to join the club. You will learn many techniques that you will use to make your jewelry, dishes and artwork. We are also a social club and have parties and social events throughout the year.

Glass Fusing

Glass fusing is the technique of joining glass pieces together by melting the glass at high temperatures. Artists take layers of glass and bond them together with high heat in a kiln to form beautiful and whimsical works of art.

Classes are offered, for a nominal fee, to anyone wishing to join the club. Students learn techniques such as draping, molding, and slumping. Then your imagination takes over!

Tools and kilns are available for every club member. Members who have done this art form for a long time are ready and willing to help newcomers.
